A. <u>Finance Committee Report</u>

President Burke reported there was no Finance Committee meeting this month.

Secretary McShane reported that she was able to get reimbursement from Embassy Suites for the 3 nights she did not attend the Institute Convention, and she is working on getting a free voucher from Special Districts for the next convention.

President Burke pointed out some items on the Financial Sheets for the benefit of the audience.

B. Volunteer Liaison Report

Vice President Cockrell reported on the May 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting. Discussions

included the Treasurer's report, the problem with their tax-exempt status has been resolved, and they put together their 2018 calendar. They discussed the Training Tower and are awaiting the announcement of the grand opening date. They volunteered at the Dream Machines event. They interviewed potential recipient of scholarships, and Vice President Cockrell indicated that instead of the money going to the scholarship recipient, the funds will go directly to the school that person will attend. He indicated that former Board Member Gregg Hosfeldt has taken a leave of absence for the rest of this year due to his wife's illness. They made almost \$6,000 profit on the Crab Feed. The monies will be used to fund their museum.
