B. Volunteer Liaison Report

Vice President Cockrell reported there was a meeting on October 3rd. Preparations for the Pumpkin Festival were discussed. Mr. Cockrell discussed the cost of volunteers' wearing apparel. There is a new training group of 13 volunteers, they are recruiting for a CERT Instructor, and they made a financial report.

C. <u>Land and Structures Committee Report</u>

Vice President Cockrell said he had a brief conversation with Jan Grey and they are still waiting to get a response from the owner of the property we are trying to acquire.

Director MacKimmie reported on the progress of Station 41. They are starting to do the driveways. He indicated the completion date may be pushed back another month, to February. He discussed the fence and retaining wall heights as well as possible negative safety issues that could happen. Chief Larkin said he will speak with the architect (Katz) regarding this issue.

There was some Board discussion about a negative post by someone on Next Door.com followed by positive comments from someone else, and the negative poster eventually withdrew his comments.

He referred to the flyer he distributed earlier tonight regarding the November 11 CERT-sponsored Preparedness Day.

President Burke provided a CSDA bill to Chief Larkin. He indicated that on Wednesday, November 6th, CSDA is holding a climate-adaption roundtable review if anyone is interested.
